

SAINT JOHN VIANNEY SCHOOL OUT OF UNIFORM DAY GUIDELINES (Dress Up or Dress Down)

The school principal may allow an out of uniform day as a motivator or reward.

Dress on these days should follow the below guidelines.

1. Students are expected to represent themselves in appropriate dress with modesty at all times. Students may wear clothes that are tasteful and in keeping with the conservative standards of a Catholic school
2. No oversized or tight fitting clothing is to be worn.
3. Extremely worn or torn garments are not permitted.
4. Pants are not to be dragging on the ground or have holes/tears.
5. Pants/shorts are to be worn at the waist, not on the hips.
6. No cutoffs, biker shorts, short shorts, skin tight shorts or inappropriate shorts
(No shorts from Oct-16 to April 14)
7. Dresses/Shorts/skirts are to be no more than 2 inches above the knee.
8. Strapless dresses, "spaghetti" straps, midriff jersey, see through mesh jersey, or tank tops are not appropriate for school.
9. All tops must have sleeves, completely cover the midriff and be modest.
10. Belts are to be worn if the clothing has belt loops
11. No shirts showing violence or suggestive sayings or inappropriate pictures or symbols or comments that can cause offense are allowed.
12. Socks (above the ankle) must be worn.
13. Baseball caps/hats, bandanas, hoods, headbands, sunglasses, visors, etc. are not allowed unless otherwise specified by the principal
14. No leggings/jeggings
15. Underclothing is NOT to be visible
16. No dangling earrings. School jewelry rules and cosmetic rules still apply on a non uniform day.
17. No sandals, open toed shoes, no backless shoes, crocs or military style boots of any kind are to be worn.
18. Pajamas, flannels or otherwise will not be allowed.

Students are expected to wear clean, neat clothes. Dress down is NOT an anything goes day. Extreme tastes in clothing are not permitted. Students that are indecently dressed, excessively sloppy or wearing clothing deemed inappropriate for school by the administration, will be asked to call home for a change of clothing into their regular school uniform.
